


Instructions

Use a **dark colored pen** to completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.


Vote for ONLY one in each contest.

Write-in Option

To vote for a write-in candidate fill in the oval next to the write-in line and print the name.

How to Correct a Vote



To make a correction, draw a line through the entire incorrect choice. You then have the option of making another choice.

Senate Joint Resolution 8201

The legislature has proposed a constitutional amendment on allowing money in Washington's long-term care fund to be invested. This amendment would allow the state fund dedicated to providing long-term care benefits for eligible seniors and people with disabilities to be invested as authorized by law.

**Proposed County Charter Amendment No. 1
Charter Amendment Regarding Coroner Duties**

The Clallam County Charter Review Commission proposes an amendment to the Clallam County Home Rule Charter, concerning the requirement that the Prosecuting Attorney serve as the ex-officio coroner. This amendment would remove the requirement that the Prosecuting Attorney serve as the ex-officio coroner, thereby removing the duties of coroner from the Prosecuting Attorney to the Board of County Commissioners of Clallam County, who would then have the responsibility to hire personnel with the appropriate credentials and training to serve as coroner.

County Issue

**Clallam County Proposition No. 1
Levy Lid Lift for County Essential Public Services**

The Board of County Commissioners of Clallam County adopted Resolution No. 61, concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund County operations. If approved, this proposition would provide additional funding to continue services which promote safety, health, and the quality of life for citizens in such areas as criminal justice, public safety, public health, land use, and parks. It authorizes a maximum regular County-General property levy rate for collection in 2026 of \$0.95 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The 2026 levy amount will be used for the purpose of computing the limitations for levies in subsequent years.

**Quillayute Park and Rec. District
Proposition No. 1
6-Year Regular Property Tax Levy**

The Board of Directors of Quillayute Park and Recreation District adopted Resolution 2025 - 1 concerning a proposition to fund maintenance and operations of District assets. This proposition would authorize a Regular property tax levy equal to \$.30 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation, for six years commencing in 2026 for collection in the years 2026 through 2031.
